

NEW COVID CASES AND 7-DAY AVERAGE-AUSTRALIA




www.covid19data.com.au* Curve shows rolling average across 7 days using arithmetic mean (centred).

EMPLOYMENT IN BUILDING AND CONSTRUCTION





SUMMARY - AUSTRALIAN OUTLOOK

- National and state borders are closed, movement within Australia is heavily restricted.
- New rules reduce the amount of activity on building sites in some states, in particular Victoria.
- Construction activity in large infrastructure remains strong but declines in other sectors are becoming increasingly evident.
- While there is expected to be a downturn in construction employment, the falls are less that other sectors of the economy, like tourism and retail.
